Orchids: My Intersex Adventure voted Number One by audiences at the 2010 Brisbane International Film Festival.

After enjoying a sold out premiere at the 11-day film festival, producer / director Phoebe Hart welcomed the news that *Orchids* shone out in an outstanding cinematic field.
